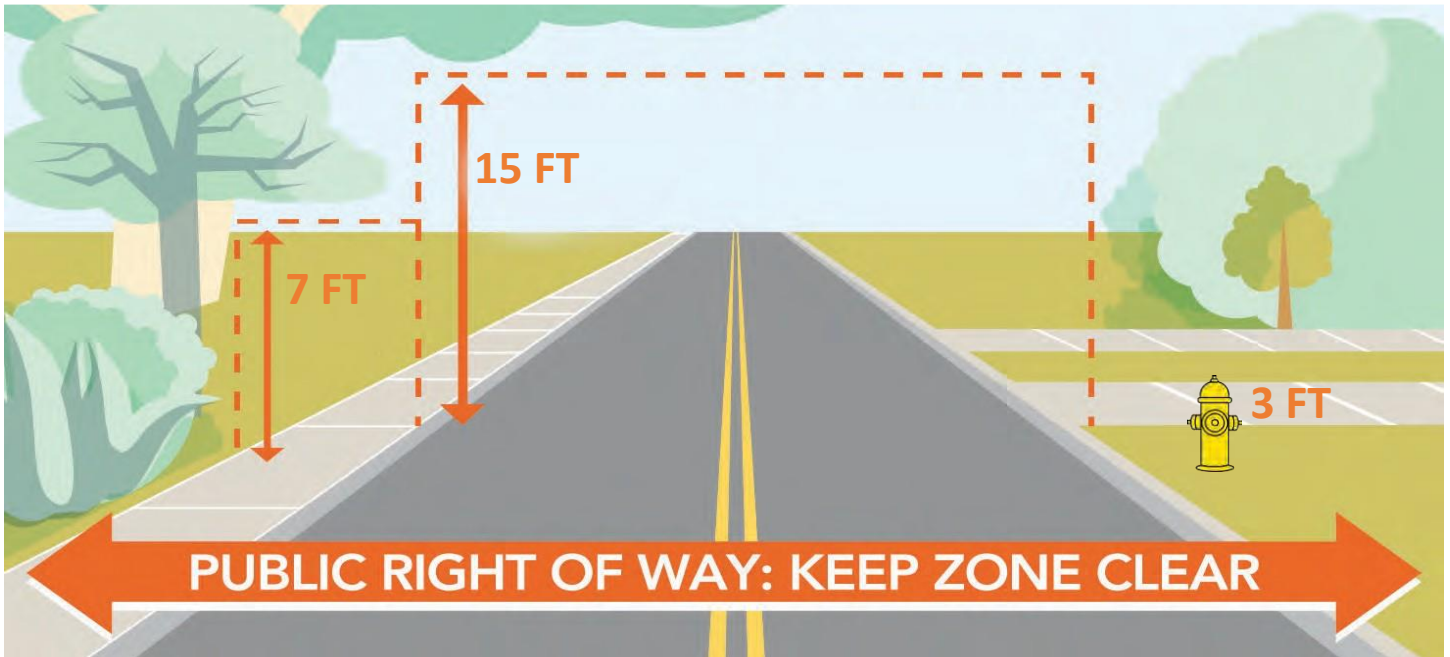


It's A Jungle out there, but the public right-of-way shouldn't be.



Did you know you as the property owner it is your responsibility for maintaining the right-of-ways around your property? This includes sidewalks, planter strips, street shoulders, hydrants, and unpaved alley way. When a property is developed, portions of the property is often dedicated as public right-of-way for utilities and other public uses such as sidewalks and streets.

Fire Hydrants must be clear of all objects and vegetation at least 3 feet around it.

Alley ways must be kept clear of obstructions that may hinder the normal flow of traffic or render the right-of-way unsafe for its current and necessary use.

Sidewalks must be clear of objects, such as basketball hoops, and vegetation, such as accumulated debris, trees and bushes, which can interfere with public use. All trees must be trimmed at least 7 feet above the sidewalk and bushes must be trimmed back off the sidewalk.

Streets must be kept clear of tree limbs and bushes. Tree limbs must be trimmed 15 feet above the street and bushes must be trimmed back so that they do not encroach on or over the street.

Street corners must have clear visibility for pedestrians and vehicles in all directions, even if no traffic signs or signals are present.
