Ride-Along Program

The Ride-Along Program provides an opportunity for citizens to experience the law enforcement function first hand. This policy provides the requirements, approval process, and hours of operation for the Ride-Along Program.

PROCEDURE TO REQUEST A RIDE-ALONG

Generally, ride-along requests will be scheduled by the Chief of Police or designee. The participant will complete the Woodland Police Department ride-along request packet which includes a waiver form. Information requested will include a valid ID or Washington driver's license, address, and telephone number. If the participant is under 18 years of age, a parent/guardian must be present to complete the Ride-Along form.

The Chief of Police or designee will schedule a date, based on availability, at least one week after the date of application if possible. If approved, a copy will be forwarded to the respective Shift Sergeant as soon as possible for his/her scheduling considerations.

If the ride-along is denied after the request has been made, a representative of the department will contact the applicant and advise him/her of the denial.

While it is the policy of this department to allow ride-alongs, the department reserves the right to deny any ride-along request. Such a denial is an "administrative decision".

ELIGIBILITY

The Woodland Police Department Ride-Along Program is offered to:

- Residents of the city.
- Students of the Woodland School District or a local college/university when enrolled in a Criminal Justice degree program.
- Those employed within the City.
- Family members of current Woodland Police Department employees are also eligible for a ride-along once every 30 days providing they would not be disqualified under this chapter.

Every attempt will be made to accommodate interested persons however **any** applicant may be disqualified without cause. Persons who do not meet the basic eligibility for a ride-along may be approved for same on a case by case basis by the Chief of Police.

Citizen ride-alongs generally will not be assigned to officers who express a desire NOT to have the assigned rider.

The following factors may be considered in disqualifying an applicant and are not limited to:

- Being under 15 years of age (generally not allowed).
- Prior criminal history (including traffic/drivers license issues).
- · Pending criminal action.
- Pending lawsuit against the Department.
- Denial by any supervisor.
- Not a resident of the City of Woodland.

AVAILABILITY

The Ride-Along Program is available on most days of the week, with certain exceptions. The ridealong times are from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Exceptions to this schedule may be made as approved by the Chief of Police or Shift Sergeant.

Juveniles will not be allowed to ride past 12:00 midnight.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Once approved, civilian ride-alongs will be allowed to ride no more than once every three months (one month for employee family members). An exception would apply to the following: Cadets, Explorers, VIP, Chaplains, Reserves, police applicants, and all others with approval of the Shift Sergeant or Chief of Police.

An effort will be made to ensure that no more than one citizen will participate in a ride-along during any given time period. Normally, no more than one ride-along will be allowed in the officer's vehicle at a given time.

SUITABLE ATTIRE

Any person approved to ride along is required to be suitably dressed in collared shirt (includes polo shirts), blouse or jacket, slacks and shoes. Sandals, T-shirts, tank tops, shorts and ripped or torn blue jeans are not permitted. Hats and ball caps will not be worn in the police vehicle. Attire with any type of offensive or potentially offensive logo is not allowed. The Shift Sergeant or field supervisor may refuse a ride along to anyone not properly dressed.

PEACE OFFICER RIDE-ALONGS

Off-duty members of this department or any other law enforcement agency will not be permitted to ride-along with on-duty officers without the expressed consent of the Shift Sergeant. In the event that such a ride-along is permitted, the off-duty employee shall not be considered on-duty and shall not represent themselves as a peace officer or participate in any law enforcement activity except as emergency circumstances may require.

OFFICER'S RESPONSIBILITY

The officer shall advise the dispatcher that a ride-along is present in the vehicle before going into service and shall so note the presence of the rider in their MDT unit history. Officers shall consider the safety of the ride-along at all times. Officers should use sound discretion when encountering a potentially dangerous situation, and if feasible, let the participant out of the vehicle in a well-lighted place of safety. The dispatcher will be advised of the situation and as soon as practical have another police unit respond to pick up the participant at that location. The ride-along may be continued or terminated at this time.

The Chief of Police or designee is responsible for maintaining and scheduling ride-alongs. Upon completion of the ride-along, the form shall be returned to the Chief of Police or designee with any comments which may be offered by the officer.

RIDE-ALONG'S RESPONSIBILITY

- The ride-along will follow the directions of the officer.
- The ride-along will remain in the police vehicle at all times unless specifically told otherwise by the officer. (Breaks and stops at police facilities do not require officer permission to exit the vehicle.)

- The ride-along will not become involved in any investigation, handling of evidence, discussions with victims or suspects, or handling any police equipment.
- The ride-along may terminate the ride-along at any time and the officer may return the observer to their home or to the station if the ride-along interferes with the performance of the officer's duties.
- Ride-alongs may be allowed to continue riding during the transportation and booking process provided this does not jeopardize their safety.
- Officers will not allow any ride-alongs to be present in any residences or situations that would jeopardize their safety or cause undue stress or embarrassment to a victim or any other citizen.
- Under no circumstance shall a civilian ride along be permitted to enter a private residence with an officer without the expressed consent of the resident or other authorized person.

ADDITIONAL GUIDELINES

- NO WEAPONS OF ANY KIND ARE PERMITTED ON THE RIDE. Do not bring guns, knives or chemical sprays on your ride.
- Be prepared for unexpected cool or wet weather.
- Do not wear any clothing with law enforcement insignia or emblems.
- Our Officers will be clean and well groomed and the same is expected from you. This
 includes bathing prior to the ride; clean, neat hair and clothing; and no excessive use of
 perfume or cologne.
- Do not bring a camera, video camera or tape recorder on your ride. These devices may distract the Officer and can create a hostile response from citizens who may not wish to be photographed or recorded.
- Bring money for a meal break and/or drinks and snacks for yourself.
- Do not consume any alcoholic beverages before your ride along.
- If you are ill, or have a cold, please call and reschedule a ride for another day.
- Keep in mind that many people that law enforcement deal with are ill, diseased, bleeding, mentally ill and unpredictable. You may be exposed to risky and unhealthy persons and environments. Prior to your ride, any exposed cuts or sores you may have must be covered with a bandage/band-aid. If you should come into contact with any blood or body fluid, IMMEDIATELY notify the Officer.
- We will attempt to make the ride-along as interesting as possible; however, we cannot guarantee constant action. Often the Officer will have to complete written reports, which could take up a large amount of your "ride" time. That is the nature of this work.
- If you have any needs, such as something to eat, drink or the use of a restroom, feel free to advise the Officer. Every effort will be made to accommodate your needs.
- Civilian riders must agree that any protected/privileged/confidential information that they may hear or observe may not be disseminated to others.
- Once a ride-along has begun, the officer being ridden with has sole control and authority
 over the ride and may terminate same at any time the officer deems it to be appropriate to
 do so. Examples of reasons to terminate a ride-along may include, but not be limited to,
 the following:
 - Improper conduct or actions by the rider.
 - Safety of the rider due to emergency circumstances/conditions.
 - Illness of the rider.
- Any violation of these requirements will result in the immediate termination of the ride.
